



ROSÉ IGP Méditerranée, France

This icon is representative of the Camargue Delta in Southern France where the Rhône River meets the Mediterranean sea. Comprised of three symbols, an anchor, a cross, and a heart. Respective they mean Hope, Faith, and Charity.



SAUVIGNON BLANC Loire Valley, France

The coat of arms of Pays-de-la-Loire re-imagined as the “queens of Loire” which pays tribute to the matriarchs that held power in France during the 1800s. More women reigned in France during this time period than any other point in its history.



SANGIOVESE Marche, Italy

The Sacred Heart a distilled representation of the Roman Catholic symbol, traditionally depicting a flaming heart with a spear in the side and a cross on top. The Sacred Heart embodies the idea of self-sacrifice and unconditional love.



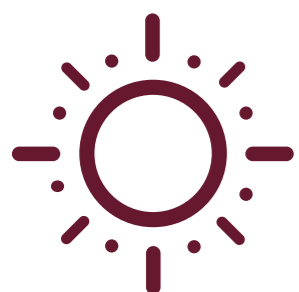
PINOT GRIGIO DOC Delle Venezie, Italy

The Quatrefoil gained popularity in the 15th century during the European Renaissance. Used predominantly in gothic architecture, stained glass windows and carved into entrances of cathedrals.



MALBEC Vista Flores, Argentina

The Andes Mountains The iconic backdrop to the Valley Floor of Mendoza. With limited annual rainfall (329mm), winemakers rely on the snow-capped mountains as their primary water source, utilizing ditch irrigation techniques to control the vigor and growth of the vines.



TORRONTÉS La Rioja, Argentina

Sunshine in a glass With limited rainfall in the region, the sky is almost always blue and the sun almost always shining. With the high altitude, the solar radiation increases allowing the growing season to extend. This extension lets the grapes mature to their full potential.
